Garbage and Recycling

Marriott-Slaterville has 70% of its residents participating in solid waste recycling. In one month, Waste Management reported that our resident's recycling efforts in Marriott-Slaterville saved 21 mature trees from timber harvest. Freed 8 cubic yards of landfill space. Conserved 4,244 kilowatts of energy. Prevented 7 metric tons of GHG emissions, and saved the use of 12,460 gallons of water. If you
