Last year Marriott-Slaterville City made an effective transition in our community to implement a new administration. Our local government in Marriott-Slaterville City is stable and enduring. As I complete my first year in office, I commit to continue our legacy of no debt and municipal property taxes. The City has a lot to do in this new year. First, the Planning Commission is preparing an updated General Plan. Many residents have commented in the planning process about how well the existing plan has served our community and would like that to continue. Next, this year we will also start a new community branding campaign for agri-commerce in the community. There are so many new agriculture trends that support Farm-to Market and Farm-to-Table and Marriott-Slaterville City is able to engage these markets.
