Marriott-Slaterville City is a wonderful place to live. I appreciate our beautiful surroundings and the friendliness of our community. However, we have challenges with community policing, crime, and law enforcement.

With these issues in mind, Sheriff Arbon has created the “Volunteer in Police Service” or VIPS Program to improve community and law enforcement relations. The VIPS Program is being implemented successfully in other communities across the nation. The VIPS Program offers many benefits to Marriott-Slaterville City. This Program uses unarmed volunteer residents who are trained by the Weber County Sheriff’s Office to assist in the community. It also improves community relations with residents and businesses relating to law enforcement. It further aids the Sheriff’s Office in making positive community impacts in crime prevention.

Marriott-Slaterville City will secure a VIPS vehicle for our resident VIPS volunteers. VIPS volunteers will conduct patrols to deter crime, contact local residents, assist businesses, provide community policing, deliver documents, assist with parking and abandoned vehicles, helping with events, and refer law enforcement matters to on-duty deputies.

Residents are familiar with the community and can provide a great service. If you have an interest in law enforcement or volunteering, this is an opportunity to serve the community. Marriott-Slaterville City and the Weber County Sheriff’s Office is actively seeking volunteers to complete the four (4) hour training course and participate in the VIPS Program. Volunteers have a positive impact on our community. Hours are flexible for volunteers with shifts as little as two (2) hours.

VIPS can apply at: www.webercountyutah.gov/sheriff. Applicants must be at least 21 years of age, no criminal history, pass a background check and drug test, and have a

good driving record. After training, volunteers will patrol neighborhoods, parks, churches, business areas, parking lots, and other places in the community. VIPS volunteers are asked to serve at least eight (8) hours per month.

I invite you to volunteer for the VIPS Program. I know it will provide an opportunity to serve and receive a positive outcome for you and our community. Thank you for your consideration.
