Mayor and City Council

Marriott-Slaterville City has two (2) separate but equal branches of government. The Executive Branch is led by the Mayor. The Legislative Branch is governed by a five (5) member City Council.

The Executive Branch handles daily operations, administration, budgeting, appointments, permits, complaints, implements policies and services, manages planning and zoning, among other responsibilities.

The Legislative Branch is the City Council. The City Council makes laws, adopts the budget, authorizes contracts, confirms appointments, and exercises oversight. Two (2) members of the City Council are elected from the

East District, and two (2) from the West District. One (1) member of the City Council member is elected At-large. The City holds elections in odd numbered years.

Communities that Care (CTC) Spaghetti Dinner Donation

A Columbia University study surveyed teens and their parents to identify the risks and protective factors relating to substance abuse. The study indicated that teens who have dinner with the family were less likely to be involved with the use of illegal drugs, alcohol, and smoking. (See: The Importance of Family Dinners VIII, September 2012. The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University).

Family engagement and conversations over dinner have a positive benefit on teenagers resulting in a lower risk of substance abuse. The fourth Monday in September is designated by the CTC to support family dinner. The CTC is operated by Weber Human Services to prevent substance abuse and support mental health.

To support Family Dinner this September, Marriott-Slaterville City is participating with Weber Human Services and Weber School District. The City Office is accepting spaghetti dinner donations for families in need. Donations will be given to the Fremont CTC. If you would like to participate please drop off at the City Office your donation of spaghetti sauce, spaghetti noodles, or canned corn. Donations are accepted 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM from September 1st to September 22nd.
