Drought Restrictions

Thanks to the residents who came to the irrigation and secondary water workshop in April. There were about 25 people who participated.

As you may know, the Governor has declared drought restrictions for the upcoming water year. Secondary water may be delayed until May 15th in some areas of the City. Once secondary water is available, watering will be restricted to every other day for those on the pressurized irrigation system. Odd numbered addresses will water on odd days, and even number addresses will water only on even days. Please plan now on ways you can conserve water.

For those who flood irrigate, follow the instructions from your ditch company. Water in the irrigation ditches may be limited to 80% of the normal flow.
