A Christmas Message

from the Mayor and City Council

Merry Christmas from Marriott-Slaterville City! As 2022 comes to a close we can reflect on the year and make goals for the next.

All our wonderful community events were back this year starting with the Easter Egg Hunt at Slaterville Park. The Fourth of July this summer was one of the best we have ever had. Lots of sunshine, games, food, and friends all around. This fall the Trunk-or-Treat landed on a perfect autumn Halloween evening attended by nearly 200 children dressed to frighten the neighborhood. Thank you to our participants and volunteers that make these events great for the community.

Another reminder that FEMA has preliminarily approved the remapping of much of the flood plain in our community. Marriott-Slaterville has a long history of catastrophic flooding. Flood prevention measures have been put in place to pre-empt damage and to manage conditions when the climate enters another flood cycle.

We accomplished many projects this year. 400 North was milled and resurfaced. Pressurized secondary water line service was extended along 400 North and a portion of 1200 West. Irrigation ponds are being improved. Slaterville Park has been converted to pressurized secondary. The Park Committee has approved the expansion of Slaterville Park to nearly double its size and link it to the Mill Creek Trail. Several storm drain projects were completed to improve the system. A portion of the sewer line on 12th Street was replaced.

We have a wonderful community where families and neighborhoods join together and participate in creating a safe and successful City. May we all endeavor to be kind, grateful, and bring about a successful new year.

Winter Travel

Snow season is here along with the travel and parking challenges in communities across the Wasatch Front. Marriott-Slaterville City has special rules that apply during snow season. There is “No Parking” on roads between 12:00 Midnight and 7:00 AM from December 1 until April 1. There is “No Parking” during a snowstorm, and for 72-hours after a snowstorm. This allows the snow plows time to clear the roads. Vehicles will be towed if illegally parked. Weber County plows the most traveled roads first in the City. Subdivisions and lesser traveled roads are plowed last. Property owners with sidewalks are responsible to remove snow from the sidewalk within 24-hours after a snowstorm.
