- Utility Fees. After the recent annual audit, some of the utility funds require adjustment to keep them from deficit. Utility rates will increase on April 1, as a result of higher fuel costs and inflation. The utility fees increasing are: garbage, storm water, and enhanced services/secondary water base rate. City sewer and recycling rates remain the same.
