Spring Flooding

It is anticipated that the spring flooding will continue through May and June. The State and National Weather Service provide daily updates to the City regarding run-off. Please continue preparations for possible flooding. Basements and crawl spaces are most likely to be impacted. Those living near the flood plain, rivers, streams, and waterways may also be impacted. The City may declare a local disaster and has stocked sandbags for emergency use. Consider obtaining flood insurance. For information on flooding visit: www.ready.gov/floods.

Mosquito Abatement District

Summer will be here soon along with a host of mosquitoes. There are a number of things that you can do to prevent and protect yourself and your family from mosquitoes and West Nile Virus.

The Weber Mosquito Abatement District (Weber MAD) recommends watching for trouble spots where water can pool or collect such as: birdbaths, fountains, rain gutters, planters, tires, buckets, over-watered areas, and troughs. If you are outside in the evening or early morning or during peak mosquito times, take measures to protect yourself from mosquitos. Annual Budget

Each May the City prepares its tentative budget. On June 15, at 6:30 PM, the City Council will hold a Public Hearing on the Final Budget. The City is proposing another balanced budget without any municipal property tax. The City has no debt.

Local Updates

- ▶ **Burn Permits.** Weber Fire District reminds residents that the Open Burn window for yard clean-up ends May 30. For a burn permit,

visit: air.utah.gov/OpenBurning/form/. Burn permits are issued by the Utah Department of Environmental Quality.

- ▶ **Lock it up!** Spring and summer bring a spike in burglaries and thefts. The Weber County Sheriff is asking you to please lock your car, lock your doors, and lock accessory buildings. Also, watch for you packages and mail so it is not left out.
- ▶ **Central Weber Sewer.** Central Weber Sewer increased rates. Contact the Sewer District for more information on rate increases.
- ▶ **Roads.** The City made rounds in April to fix pot holes in the roads. Another round of pot hole repair will be made in May. Contact the City at 801-627-1919 for pot hole repair.
- ▶ **Secondary Water.** Secondary water will commence on or after May 1. Irrigation season was delayed as a result of the wet spring. No drought restrictions are anticipated this summer.
