Spring Flooding

Mosquito Abatement District

Summer will be here soon along with a host of mosquitoes. There are a number of things that you can do to prevent and protect yourself and your family from mosquitoes. Weber Mosquito Abatement District recommends removing trouble spots where water can pool. If you are outside in the evening or early morning or during peak mosquito times, take measures to protect yourself from mosquitos. In May the City will present its tentative budget. On June 20, at 6:30 PM, the City Council will hold a Public Hearing on the Final Budget. The City is proposing another balanced budget without any municipal property tax.
