## Spring Clean-up

Its time again for Spring clean-up! Dumpsters will be located at Marriott Park and Slaterville Park on **April 25th and 26th**. Clean-up your yard and the community. Please place all debris inside the dumpster. Do not leave any debris on the ground. This is a complimentary service. Please be considerate of others using the dumpsters. Tires and other hazardous material are prohibited. To dispose of junk cars, call the City Office at 801-627-1919.

## Secondary Water

Please expect drought restrictions this year. For those using flood irrigation, the irrigation companies may be delayed turning on water until after May 1, and flows may be cut. Those with pressurized irrigation will likely not have service until May 1. Businesses should water in the

morning or late afternoon. Residents should water during the night. This help maintain adequate pressure during water shortages and prevent evaporation.

## Dark Sky Lights Required

In 2017, an overwhelming numbers of residents in our City demanded Dark Sky lighting. The City adopted a Dark Sky Ordinance that limits outdoor lighting. Light pollution affects sleep patterns and health. Please turn off your lights. Replace outdoor lights that are not compliant.
